Report on the Event

The invited Talk was conducted by the Department of Computer Science & Applications on 6 January 2023 at 12:30 Pm, for MCA Students. The resource person for the day was Mr. Premanand S, Branch Head, Shankar IAS Academy, Bengaluru It began by welcoming the Resource Person and the participants. Mr. Premanand S then took over the session and introduced about the Career Opportunities to the students.

The session started with an introduction about the different career options available in the market for Computer Science students. Mr. Premanand S informed about the various career opportunities in different IT sectors like Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning, Block chain etc. He spoke about the job opportunities for Computer Science students in government, public sectors, ISRO and DRDO. He emphasized on reading newspaper to know about the various job opportunities available and in turn one can enhance the related technical skill.

Mr. Premanand S emphasized more on the different civil services exams like UPSC, IAS, IPS, IDES etc. He informed about the UPSC exam stating that it is conducted in three phases.

Mr. Premanand S also advised to thoroughly read newspaper regularly to prepare better for the UPSC exam. He even advised to spend maximum 5 years to pass the Civil Services Exam and if cannot then leave this opportunity and shift to other career paths.

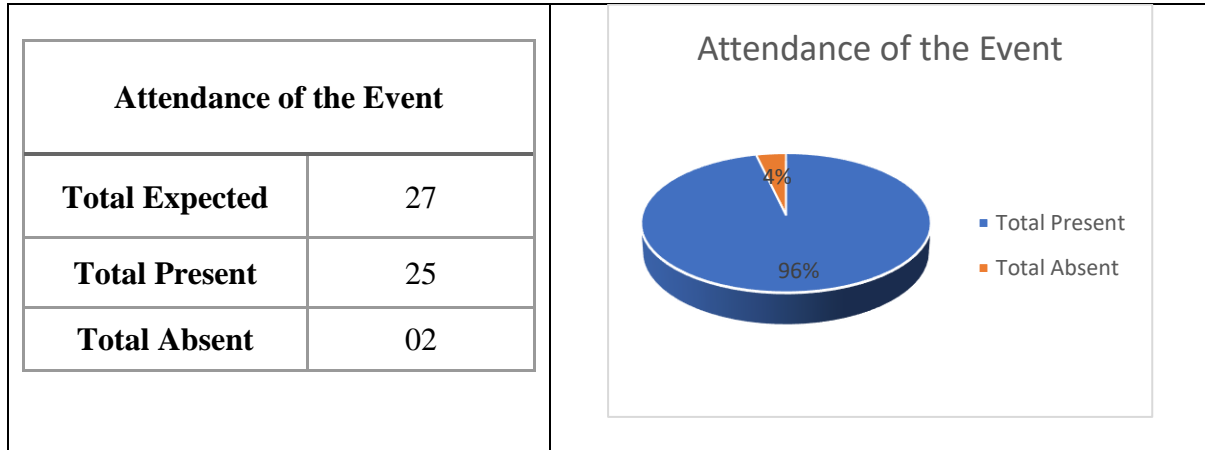
Mr. Premanand S explained the students that a UPSC posts for 24 different Civil Services are filled through Civil Service Examination (CSE) conducted by Union Public Service Commission. Out of lakhs of aspirants, only a few thousand students can successfully clear this examination. Although there are 23 different Civil Services, the most popular services are Indian Administrative Services (IAS), Indian Police Services (IPS), Indian Revenue Services (IRS) and Indian Foreign Services (IFS). The allotment of services to successful candidates depends on the rankings obtained in the examination. A candidate after getting selected in service is appointed to various posts (in the span of his career) within that service except in some cases where he/she may go on deputation to another department in another service.

Later Mr. Premanand S talked about the UPSC CSE Prelims to the students that it consists of two papers namely General Studies I and CSAT (General Studies Paper-II). While CSAT is qualifying in nature, the marks obtained in the General Studies paper determine your selection for UPSC Mains. It means your score in the General Studies Paper will be considered for the Prelims cutoff.

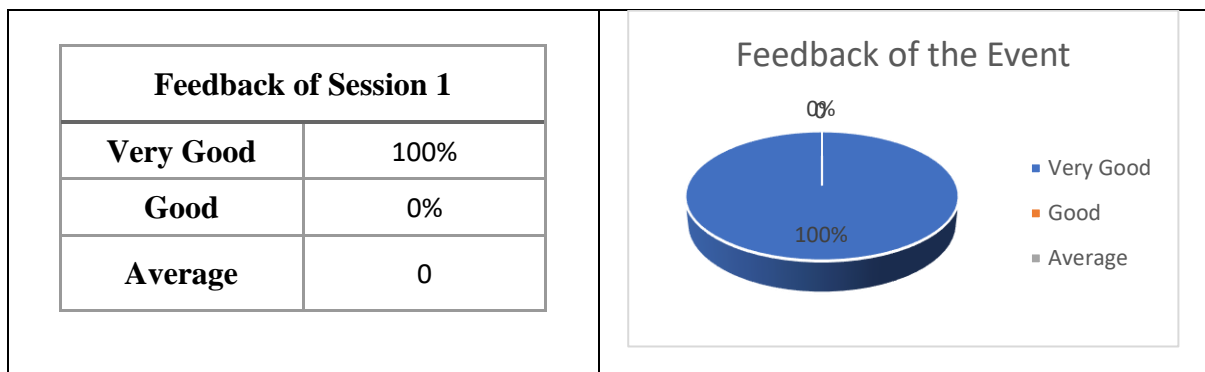
Mr. Premanand S then talked about the Shankar IAS academy, one of the best institutions in India for coaching and mentoring thousands of Civil Service aspirants was founded in 2004. The academy which was nothing, has evolved over the years to the extent of successfully helping 1700+ candidates realise their dream of becoming a bureaucrat and guiding thousands of others to realise their potential. Finally, he ended the session with the advice to follow the interested career path at a time and not jump between many paths.

Overall, the session was insightful on Career Opportunities to the students. The main aim of the session was to remind students the importance of civil services and how to take up the civil service exams for a better Career Opportunities.
