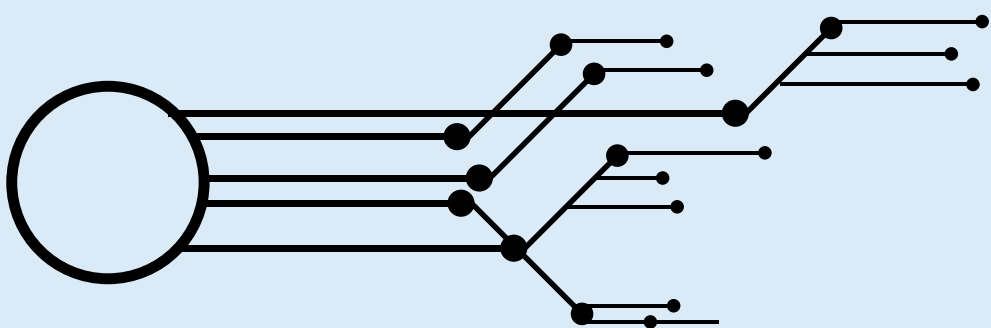

Submission Guidelines

- Faculty members, academicians, industry professionals, research scholars, and students are invited to submit original research papers, conceptual papers, case studies, and review articles relevant to the conference theme and sub-themes.
- Submissions must be original and unpublished, and should not be under consideration for publication or presentation elsewhere.
- Abstracts should be between 250–300 words clearly stating the title, objectives, methodology, key findings, and implications. Include 3–5 keywords. Abstracts should align with one of the conference tracks.
- Full papers should be between 3,500–5,000 words, Title, Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Review of Literature, Methodology, Results/Discussion, Conclusion, and References. The paper should follow APA 7th edition style for formatting and referencing.
- Mention name(s) of author(s), institutional affiliation, email ID, and contact number on a separate cover page.
- Plagiarism should not exceed 10–15% (excluding references).
- At least one author of each accepted paper must register and present the paper in online or offline mode.

Note: Acceptance of papers is subject to the relevance to the conference theme and the quality of the submission, as determined by the review committee. Registration fees will be refunded only in the event of non-acceptance of the paper.

Presenters based in Bengaluru are required to present their papers in offline mode.



All presenters will receive certificates of presentation, and exceptional scholarly work will be rewarded through a cash prize for the Best Paper.
